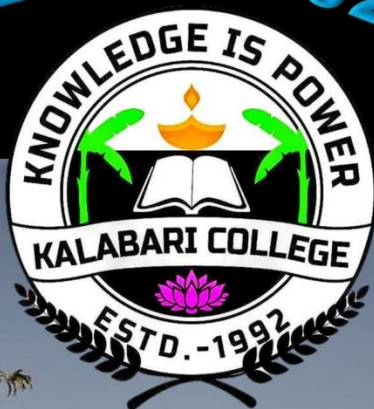


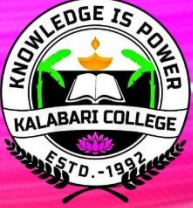

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION

Applications for admission to the college should be made in prescribed form available in the college office. Admission to the college is strictly on merit and subject to approval of the principal. There is reservation for SC, OBC and ST students.

There is sports, music and physically disable quota for admission.

**Note:** (i) the bulletin of information and admission forms are sold from 10am to 2pm on all working days. Similarly admission forms are accepted only during the above hours. Last date of receipt of forms in the college office is pasted on the notice board.

(ii) the dates of interview for admission to the various classes are notified in advance.



A list of the eligible candidates for admission is put up on the college notice board before the day of interview. Interview and admission are taken place on same day and at same time. The candidate will have to be present personally in the interview with the following documents and papers:

- (A) Provisional Certificate from the head of the institution last attended.
- (B) Certificate of Date of Birth.
- (C) Mark Sheet (original).
- (D) Gap Period Certificate from appropriate person if any (for a maximum of one year only)
- (E) Two copies Passport size photograph.

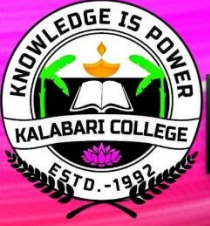

### COURSE OF STUDY :

The college offers courses leading to-

- A. B.A. Degree in TDC (affiliated to Gauhati University). The college offers Honours (Major) in Assamese, Economics, Political Science, Education, History and English.
- B. A student can take admission in post graduate classes in Assamese, History, Economics, Political Science, English. Education and other diploma courses (IDOL, GU.)
- C. A student can take admission B.A. Course & M.A. Course under K.K. Handiqui State Open University at our college study centre.

**DEGREE LEVEL COURSE (Undergraduate)**

From the academic session 2019-2020, the credit based semester system was replaced by the Choice Based Credit System (popularly called as CBCS) which is more learner centric and provides students with autonomy in deciding courses as per their choice and pace of learning.

A few specific points relating to CBCS have been summarised below. For details please go through the Regulation of the Under Graduate Choice Based Credit System (UGCBCS), Gauhati University available on GU website.

The courses to be offered under CBCS are categorised as Core Courses, Elective Courses or Ability Enhancement Courses.

**A. Core Courses (CC):** A core course is a course that has to be compulsorily Studied. A student pursuing BA or BSc with honours will have to take up 14 core courses, each of 6 credits and the student pursuing BA or BSc regular (earlier General or Pass Course) will need to take up 12 core courses each again of 6 credits. [Credit here refers to 1 Credit= 1 Theory/Tutorial period of one hour duration or 1 Credit= 1 Practical period of two hours duration]

**B. Elective Courses (EC):** An elective course is to be chosen by the student from a pool of such courses on offer will be restricted in initial years and are of three types:

**B.1 Discipline Specific Elective Course (DSEC):** It is an elective course offered by the main discipline. A student enrolled in BA/BSc degree program with honours will have to earn 24 course credits from DSEC. While a student in non-honours BSc degree program will have to earn 36 credits from DSEC, the requirement for students in non-honours BA/B.Com. degree program is 24 credits from DSECs.



## DEGREE LEVEL COURSE (Undergraduate)

**B.2 Generic Elective Course (GEC):** A GEC is a course offered by an unrelated discipline and has the objective of broadening the academic experience of a student. A student enrolled in UG degree program viz. BA/BSc with honours can acquire 24 course credits from GECs. Please note GECs are not available to students in non-honours UG Science program while other non-honours UG programmes require students to take up to such courses.

**B.3 Dissertation/Project:** All students enrolled in an UG degree program (both Honours and Non-honours) will have the option of choosing to undertake project/dissertation work for 6 credits in lieu of a 6 credit OSEC in the fifth semester only.

**B.4 Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** AEC which are to be taken up by students in an UG program will be of two types:

**B.4.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** These 4 credit courses are mandatory for every student enrolled in UG degree program. A student will have to take up 4 credit course in Environmental Science and a second 4 credit course in English Communication/MIL Communication.

**B.4.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** These are value based courses and there will be pool of courses on offer. A student enrolled in an UG degree program with honours will have to take up a minimum of two SEC course of 4 credits each. For students enrolled in non-Honours UG degree program the credit requirements from SECs will be 16 credits. These SECs will be offered from the University Grants Commission (UGC) list or will be prepared by the college depending local requirement which will be offered with prior approval of the affiliating University.

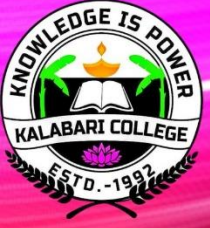

## DEGREE LEVEL COURSE (Undergraduate) - ARTS STREAM

A student enrolled in undergraduate B.A. honours or B.A. non-honours programme can choose his or her core papers or discipline specific elective papers from the following subjects which are available in the college.

**HC (Honours Core) :** Assamese, English, Political Science, Education, History, Economics.

**RC (Regular Core) :** Assamese, English, Political Science, Education, History, Economics, Geography, Alt. Assamese.

The student under B.A. honours or non-honours courses can choose Assamese or Alternative English as subjects for MIL communication in the required semester. MIL communication in subjects other than mentioned subjects will not be allowed due to absence of faculty in the college.

The Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses will be as specified in the program template (table 2 &4).

Details of Discipline Specific Courses will be made available to students once they are prepared by our affiliating university i.e. Gauhati University. Similarly, relating to choice of Generic Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses from a pool of such courses will be made available once they are floated by the University. For the time being, the student is requested for the course as per the requirement and number provided in the program template of the respective undergraduate program.

Student, who will be admitted under additional shift has to take General English and MIL (Assamese) as compulsory subjects and can choose Education or Economics and Political Science or History as Regular (general) subjects. Students enrolled under additional shift will not be allowed to pursue honours courses at any circumstances.



## EXAMINATION, EVALUATION AND GRADING UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM

The Three Years Degree Course shall be of Six Semesters covering 3 (three) calendar years. The schedule for the semester system shall be as per G.U. Academic Calendar.

### A. Examination:

Under CBCS, examination whether internal or external, theory or practical shall be counted separately for the purpose of considering a student passed or failed. A few guideline of the university is reproduced here for direct reference.

**A.1.** If a student does not appear in a paper (internal or external, theory of practical) in an examination, the student will be considered failed in that paper. Any paper where a student fails will be called an Arrear paper for that student.

**A.2.** A student having arrear in external examination (EE) shall be allowed to clear the same in the next available end-semester examinations with the following restrictions:

**1.** No student will be allowed to appear in the first and fifth semester examinations simultaneously.

**2.** No student will be allowed to appear in the 2nd and 6th semester examinations simultaneously.

**A.3.** The first and fifth semester examinations will be held simultaneously, while the third semester examination will be held separately. Similarly, the second and sixth semester examinations will be held simultaneously, while the fourth semester examination will be held separately.

**A.4.** A student may be allowed once to appear in any one of the honours theory papers in each of the first, second and third semesters for betterment of marks if the candidate secured pass marks in all papers. Students will be allowed to reappear only in the next similar examinations. Marks obtained either in the earlier examination or in the subsequent examination, whichever is higher, will be awarded to the student.

**A.5.** No betterment will be allowed in internal and practical examinations in any semester.



## EXAMINATION, EVALUATION AND GRADING UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM

**A.6.** A student must pass all her/his semester examinations, including arrear and betterment chances within six years i.e. six academic session from the date of admission to the first semester. In the event of a student failing to do so, she/he will have to take fresh admission in the first semester.

**A.7.** There shall be no scope for a student to appear as Private Candidate in any course.

**A.8.** Schedule of examinations will be as per the concerned Academic calendar. The exact dates of examination and related information will be notified by the office of the Controller of Examination, Gauhati University.

### **B. Evaluation:**

Under CBCS, a student's performance is monitored, throughout the semesters by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the students' performance in each semester for every course /paper will be based on (a) Internal Assessment (IA) (b) End Semester Examination (ESE). For a student to pass in a course/paper, she/he has to pass in both IA and ESE separately.

**B.1:** Internal Assessment: IA will ideally account for 20% of the total marks allotted to a course or paper.

**B.2.a.** IA shall be based on attendance, sessional examination, 75 percent or above class attendance, home assignment, seminars and library work in each semester. Marks allotted for internal evaluation in each paper will be based on.

**8.2.b.** Sessional examination carries 50 percent of the total internal marks of each paper (for example, if internal mark of a subject is 20 then marks of sessional examination will be 10)

**8.2.c.** The sessional examination will be held for 30 marks for the convenience of setting questions and covering the syllabus and the marks secured by the students will be proportionately converted to be out of 10 marks. The duration of the examination will be one hour.

**B.2.d.** Home assignment, seminars, group discussion class attendance above 75 percent or related works will carry rest 50% of the internal mark of the subject, i.e. if internal marks allotted for a subject is 20, then under these subheads a total 10 marks will be assigned. However, out of this, a maximum of 4 marks will be allotted for class attendance component based on attendance in classes. For example, 1 mark for attendance from 76% to 80% 2 marks for attendance from 81% to 85% 3 marks for attendance from 86% to 90% and 4 marks from 91% to 100%.



# EXAMINATION, EVALUATION AND GRADING UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM

## C. END SEMESTER EXAMINATION (ESE):

The ESE will comprise of 80% of the total marks earmarked for a course. The ESE shall be of three hours duration for a course whose ESE component exceeds 50 marks. For a student to pass in a course/paper, she/he has to pass in both Internal Assessment and End Semester Examination separately.

## EXAMINATIONS, EVALUATION AND GRADING:

### Examinations:

Examinations, whether internal or external, theory or practical would be counted separately for the purpose of considering a student passed or failed.

- If a student does not appear in a paper (internal or external, theory or practical) in an examination, the student will be considered failed in that paper. Any paper where a student fails will be called an 'Arrear' paper of that student. In case a student fails in any one or more papers in an end semester examination, she/he can appear in all the papers in which she/he failed.
- A student having 'arrear' in external examination, either in theory or practical papers, shall be allowed chance to clear the same in the next available end-semester examinations, with the following restrictions:
- No student will be allowed to appear in the first and fifth semester examinations simultaneously.
- No student will be allowed to appear in the second and sixth semester examinations simultaneously.
- The first and the fifth semester examinations will be held simultaneously, while the third semester examination will be held separately. Similarly, the second and the sixth semester examinations will be held simultaneously, while the fourth semester examination will be held separately. A student may be allowed once to reappear in any one of the honours theory papers in each of the first, second and third semesters for betterment of marks if the candidate secured 'pass marks' in all papers. Students will be allowed to reappear only in the next similar examination. Marks obtained either in the earlier examination or in the subsequent examination, whichever is higher, will be awarded to the student.
- No betterment will be allowed in internal and practical examinations in any semester.
- A student must pass all her/his semester examinations, including 'arrear' and 'betterment' chances within six years from the date of admission to the first semester. In this context, Six years Means six academic sessions. In the event of a student failing to do so, she/he will have to take fresh admission in the first semester. Subject to the said condition, a student who could not appear or who failed in any semester examination will be allowed chance to clear the same as follows:



## EXAMINATION, EVALUATION AND GRADING UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM

- i. First semester with regular third semester examination.
  - ii. Second semester with regular fourth semester examination.
  - iii. Third semester with regular fifth semester examination.
  - iv. Fourth semester with regular sixth semester examination.
- There shall be no scope for a student to appear as Private Candidate in any course.
  - Schedule: The schedule for examinations will be as per the concerned Academic Calendar. The exact dates of examinations and related information will be notified by the office of the controller of Examinations, Gauhati University.

**Evaluation:** A student's performance will be evaluated throughout the year based on continuous assessment. Evaluation of the student's performance in each semester for every course/paper will be based on the following.

- Internal Assessment (IA)
- End Semester Examination (ESE)

For a student to pass in a course/paper, she/he has to pass in both Internal Assessment and End Semester Examination separately.

**Internal Assessment (IA):** IA will ideally account for 20% of the total marks allotted to a course/paper. For evaluating the performance of the students in a continuous way, the following measured will be adopted for distributing marks earmarked for IA.

- ❖ Sessional or mid-term examination will be conducted for 50% of the total marks allotted for IA of a course/paper. (For example, if 20 marks is allotted for IA of a course/paper, then 10 marks will be kept aside for assessment in sessional or mid-term examination. The sessional examination will be held for 30 marks for the convenience of setting questions and covering the syllabus and the marks secured by the students will be proportionately converted to be out of 10 marks. Duration of the examination will be on hour. The question papers of the sessional or mid-term examinations will be set by the concerned teacher(s) and the evaluated answer scripts will be shown to the students and corrections will be made, if any.
- ❖ 20% of the marks allotted for IA will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. If the total marks for IA is 20, then 4 marks will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. The following criteria will be adopted for awarding marks under this category:
  - a) Class attendance for 76% to 80% ..... 1 mark;
  - b) Class attendance from 81% to 85% ..... 2 marks;
  - c) Class attendance from 86% to 90% ..... 3 marks;
  - d) Class attendance form 91% and above ..... 4 marks.
- ❖ Rest 30% of the marks allotted fur IA will be distributed and awarded on the basis of performance of the students on the following criteria:



## EXAMINATION, EVALUATION AND GRADING UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM

Rest 30% of the marks allotted for IA will be distributed and awarded on the basis of performance of the students on the following criteria:

- a) Home assignments;
- b) Seminar/Group discussions;
- c) Field work;
- d) Performance in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

*For odd semesters, ESE will be held in the month of November and for the even semesters, the examination will be held in the month of May.*

### C.1 PASS MARKS:

The pass marks will be as follows:

Theory paper: 30%

Practical paper: 40%

- a) A student must pass in both internal and external examinations of a paper (theory and practical) separately if he/she has to pass in that paper. Passing a UG course in any subject does not automatically imply qualifying in Honours, if any.
- b) The following rules will apply for Bachelor Degree in any subject with Honours:
  - i. Simple pass: 30% to 39% marks in aggregate, i.e., from CGPA 4.00 to less than CGPA 5.00.
  - ii. Pass with Honours: 40% marks or above in aggregate in Honours subjects, i.e., minimum of CGPA 5.00.
  - iii. In case a student with Honours in any subject secures less than 40% marks in aggregate (i.e. CGPA less than 5) but 30% or above in the Honours subject, she/he shall be declared "Simple Pass".
  - iv. In case of project work or dissertation, it shall be a separate paper with separately allotted marks and cannot be treated as part of any other theory paper. Pass mark for project work of dissertation will be 50%.

### C. 2 NUMBER OF ATTEMPTS:

- a) A student who has completed a semester may be allowed to proceed to the next semester, irrespective of the number of papers in which she/he failed. In order to complete an UG degree, a student must obtain pass marks in all the papers prescribed.
- b) A student having failed to fill in his examination form in the first semester may be allowed to appear in the second semester if all other eligibility criteria are fulfilled.





# EXAMINATION, EVALUATION AND GRADING UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM

## C. 3 GRADING:

The grading system of GU is the one recommended by the UGC. This grading system will be relative grading under which the marks obtained by a student are converted to grades based on a pre-determined formula. Following points are to be understood to have complete knowledge about the grading system.

(a) Credit: A unit by which course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching/tutorial or two hours of practical per week.

(b) Letter Grade: It is an index of the performance of students in a course. Grades are denoted by O, A+, A, B+, B, C, P and F.

(c) Grade point: It is numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale

(d) Credit point: It is the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.

## Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA):

It is the measure of performance of work done in a semester. It is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places.

$$SGPA (S_j) = \frac{\sum (C_{ij} \times G_j)}{C_{ij}}$$

where  $S_j$  = SGPA of the jth semester

$C_{ij}$  = number of credits for the ith course of the jth semester

$G_j$  = grade point obtained by the student in the ith course of the jth semester.

## Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters. It is the ratio of sum of product of the SGPA of each semester and the respective credits earned divided by the total credits earned in the programme.

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum (C_j S_j)}{\sum C_j}$$

Where,  $C_j$  = credits earned in semester j,

$S_j$  = SGPA in semester j,

$C$  = Total Credits earned in the programme.

2. (i) In Honours and Regular Subjects involving practical, the distribution of marks for theory and practical papers are as shown in the Syllabus of the subject concerned.

(ii) Students' performance should be monitored throughout the semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the students' performance in each of the theory and practical papers will be based in the following:

Internal Evaluation: 20% Marks

External Evaluation : 80% Marks

(iii) Internal Evaluation should be based on two Sessional Examinations, home assignments, seminars and Library work in each semester.

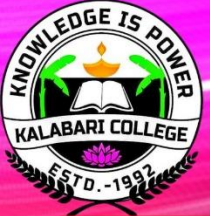
- (iv) External evaluation should be through a final examination at the end of the semester.
- (v) The pass marks in each theory paper is 30% and that in each practical paper is 40%
- (vi) In each paper students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation separately.
- (vii) A student who could not appear or failed in any semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows:
  - (a) First Semester with the regular Third Semester Examination.
  - (b) Second Semester with the regular Forth Semester Examination.
  - (c) Third Semester with the regular Fifth Semester Examination.
  - (d) Fourth Semester with the regular Sixth Semester Examination.
- (viii) A student may be allowed to “repeat” any one of the theory papers in the First, Second, Third and Fourth Semester and may be allowed for ‘betterment’ of marks in one paper in the Fifth Semester, provided the student secures less than 45% marks in that papers.
- (ix) No ‘Repeat/betterment’ shall be allowed in the Practical examinations in any semester.
- (x) A student must pass all his semester examination including ‘repeat’ and ‘betterment’ chances within six years from the date of admission to the First year semester course. A student will get a maximum of three chances to clear a particular semester.
- (xi) Since the semester involve continuous assessment there would be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any subject.
- (xii) There are Six University Examinations:

Part I:	I & II Semester
Part II :	III & IV Semester
Part III :	V & VI Semester
- (xiii) MIL includes Assamese only.
- (xiv) General English is compulsory for all 1st year students.
- (xv) Class attendance of a student should not be less than 75%

## COLLEGE LIBRARY AND LIBRARY RULES:

There is a well-managed library. The library is equipped with substantial number of books and journals to satisfy curriculum, researches and other references.

A student can take the various services of the library such as book reading, newspaper reading, journal and magazine reading, borrowing books on loan for reading in their home, etc. by applying on a separate application provided by the librarian within a specified period of time. After taking admission in the college each student are requested to contact the librarian to apply for the Library Card.

The library remains open from 10.00 a.m. to 4 p.m. on each working day except the gazette holidays, Sundays and any other declared holidays. To digitize its library service Soul 2.0 is install in the library in November, 2019. A new Library building is under construction for the library within the college premises and is about to complete.

### LIBRARY RULES

1. To obtain, various services of the library a Library card is must. So after taking admission in the college each student are requested to apply for the library I-card by taking an application form the library office.
2. Library card is not transferable. In each student name there is only one Library card.
3. Books are issued to the students for a period of fifteen (15) days only for the first time, after that the same book can be renewed for two (2) times i.e. 30 days. After that the specified book has to return and can take another book on loan.
4. An overdue charge of Rs1/- only per day is levied if a book is kept beyond due time.
5. Borrowers must check the physical condition of the Book before getting them issued. Otherwise they will be held responsible for any damage or mutation notice at the time of return.
6. Books on loan with members can be recalled at any time without assigning any reason thereof.
7. A fine of Rs. 50/- will be charged for reissue of a Library card.
8. Each member of the library is responsible for any misuse of the library card issued in their name. So if a library card is lost due to some reason it is the duty of a member to inform the librarian immediately with an application form, otherwise he/she will be responsible for any misuse of the card.

## **STUDENTS AID FUND:**

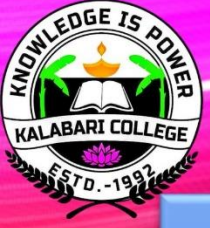
